Clerk's Report

1. Of matters reported at previous meeting:

- a. Clerk & RFO JD: A revised JD will be circulated prior to the next meeting.
- b. **Highways Matters:** The Clerk again reported the issue of visibility of junction at Weeping Cross. The hedge was cut back before being reported.
 - Route beyond Oaklands Farm towards Eaton Mascott. When J. Ingleby visited site, the boulder had been removed.
- c. Planning ENFs. Pl. Officer (FW) agreed that the visibility splays on exit from Stoneleigh Park were sub-standard but would need to consult with Highways to see what could be done. The construction at Frodesley Lodge is still being investigated: Caravan or Not?

2. Item 19.7.9 Defibrillators.

- a. Pitchford: The code was bleached by sun and moisture and was no longer visible. Clerk redid code and did a test and battery check, both of which were 'Good'.
- b. Ruckley & Langley installation: The Clerk has been in contact with the barn owner and will be pushing this forward, over the coming weeks.

3. Item 19.7.13 Planning

- a. Home Farm Barns. Applicants have been asked to submit plan amendments as there are Heritage and Conservation issues, with the number and size of openings. The Planning Officer is asking the PC to note the Conservation Officers report.
- b. Mulberry House: The PC submitted a formal complaint regarding the decision not to uphold ENF. A response is due by
 - The Planning Notice for the car port was put on the post by the bridge. After being notified the new Officer was reported to have reposted it correctly.

4. Item 19.7.14 CIL & Place Plans

5. The IIG have supported the PCs EOI for £8,525 of CIL money, in order to extend the Acton Burnell paved footpath to the entrance of Stoneleigh Park. This is subject to appropriate Technical Checks.

6. Item 19.7.15 Parish Matters

- a. Village Bus Service. After the SC consultation, the recommendation going forward is that there are no cuts to rural bus services, but still to increase Park & Ride group fares.
- b. Letter received requesting that the PC invite WM Police to explain Smart Water coverage.
- c. Dog Waste Bins. These are supplied, installed and emptied free of charge.

7. Item 19.7.16 Next Meetings

Concord College has confirmed that they will accommodate PC winter meeting dates: Nov. 12th 2019 at 7.30pm, Jan. 21st 2020 at 7.30pm, Mar.10th 2020 at 7.30pm.

8. For Information

- a. Period of Public Rights. This year's period runs from 17th June to 26th July.
- b. Pensions Regulator. Review of staff qualifying for the workplace pension is required every 3 years. PC due to submit a re-declaration from August with a deadline in November.
- c. Website Accessibility regulations. PC needs to ensure compliance but the implications are still unknown. SALC is looking in to this on behalf of the local PCs.
- d. 'A Board' Policy Review: Restrict to 1 rather than 2? PC s responsibility to ensure H&S.
