DEFIBRILLATORS

Defibrillators for public use can be found at:

- Acton Burnell: on the side wall of the Post Office
- Frodesley: in the telephone kiosk at the Frodesley crossroads
- Pitchford: at the village hall, to the left of the main door
- Ruckley: on the front wall of Ruckley Home Farm


The defibrillator can be used by any member of the public. It can be used if someone is unconscious and you think, or suspect, that they may have had a cardiac arrest or heart attack.

If you think someone has had a heart attack:

- 1. Before you do anything else dial **999** to alert the ambulance service.
- 2. Go immediately to the defibrillator and unlock the cabinet door by entering the code which you will find on the door of the cabinet.
- 3. Picture guides and verbal instructions will lead you through the process to follow.
- 4. The defibrillator runs checks on the patient's heart rhythm, and only allows you to go ahead if defibrillation is needed the defibrillator will not work on someone who is not in cardiac arrest.
- 5. The defibrillator may also instruct you to carry out CPR (chest compressions). The unit gives clear instructions on how to do this

This information has been provided by the defibrillator suppliers and is meant for guidance only.

IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY, ALWAYS FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS PROVIDED BY THE DEFIBRILLATOR UNIT.



THE PARISH COUNCIL

A OUICK GUIDE

- Covers Acton Burnell (including Acton Pigott), Frodesley, Pitchford, Ruckley & Langley.
- Has a range of responsibilities, including looking after community buildings, street lighting, bus shelters and traffic calming measures.
- Comments on local planning applications to Shropshire Council (but does not make decisions).
- Responsible for producing a 'Community Led Plan' every 3-5 years, which
 identifies the main areas of concerns of the local community and helps to
 guide future improvements, developments and financial investment.
- Funded by the County Council (via Council Tax). It also receives annual 'Community Benefit' payments from local solar power farms. This money is used to support local groups and projects.
- Parish Councillors are unpaid. They must either: live in (or within three miles of) the parish; or work there; or own property/land there.
- Councillors serve for 4 years, after which they must stand for re-election. If only one candidate comes forward, then no election takes place. If there are no candidates for a vacancy, then the Parish Council can co-opt someone to fill the place.
- Parish Council meetings take place once every two months. See the Parish Council website (www.actonburnellparishcouncil.org.uk) for details of upcoming meetings and minutes of previous meetings.
- Members of the public can attend any Parish Council meeting, but may be asked to leave if the Council is discussing confidential matters.

Travelling by car

The hospital is signposted from the A5223.

Car parking charges apply at both hospitals. The first 20 minutes is free; parking for up to 2 hours will cost £3.50; for up to 3 hours £4.50; for up to 4 hours £5.50; for up to 5 hours £6.50; up to 24 hours £8.50. Payment can be made by cash or credit card, or online on the day of the visit at https://sathparking.keyivr.com.

Concessions are available for patients receiving frequent or long term care, and parking is free for patients receiving renal dialysis, receiving treatment in the O'Connor Oncology Unit, for people visiting in connection with a bereavement and for parents of children staying in hospital overnight. Registered disabled persons with a blue badge may park for free but you need to report to the Car Park Attendants who will register your vehicle details on their system.

RUBBISH COLLECTION AND RECYCLING

RUBBISH COLLECTION AND RECYCLING

Kerbside collection is on Fridays (there may be a change of day around bank holidays). General household rubbish (darker coloured or grey wheelie bin) is collected once a fortnight and recycling boxes and garden waste (green bins) are collected on alternate fortnights.

Go to www.shropshire.gov.uk/recycling-and-rubbish/when-is-my-bin-collected/to find a collection calendar.

Cans, plastics and glass can all be placed in one box, and cardboard and paper placed in the blue bag. Garden and food waste (including fruit, veg peelings, coffee grounds, tea bags and meat, fish and cheese waste) should be placed in the green wheelie bin. Batteries can be placed in a clear plastic bag and put out next to your recycling boxes on recycling day.

The darker coloured or grey wheelie bin is for all items not included above and for all items which cannot be recycled.

Larger items or items not included in the list above (such as unused paint, oils, metal waste etc) can be taken to Shrewsbury Household Recycling Centre Vanguard Way, Battlefield Enterprise Park, Shrewsbury SY1 3TG. The centre is open daily (except Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day) from 9.00am to 5.00pm. It is open to all householders, but if you are visiting the site with a van or trailer, you may need to apply for a permit. Bulky items can be collected for a fee by telephoning **0345 678 9007**.

Some items (such as furniture) can be donated to a local recycling charity or scheme. Please note that under Covid restrictions there may be limitations on what can be accepted, and you may need to book an appointment before dropping off any items. Please call the charity or scheme to check in advance.

LIBRARIES

Library membership is free to anyone who lives, works or studies in Shropshire. You can apply on-line at **www.shropshire.gov.uk/libraries/join-the-library/** or in person at one of the libraries. You will need to provide proof of your address.

Borrowing books is free, but there is a charge if you do not return your books on time (currently this is 25p per day, up to a total of £5 per book). There is no charge for overdue children's books. There is a charge for borrowing DVDs, CDs and audiobooks.

Shropshire Libraries also offers a 'Ready Reads' service. Complete an online form (follow the links from www.shropshire.gov.uk/libraries/ready-reads-collect/) to let the library know what kind of books you like, and they will put together a selection for you to collect from your local library.

Library members can also use the on-line book catalogue at https://libraries.shropshire.gov.uk/web/arena to search for and reserve books.

Babies and toddlers can join the Bookstart Bear Club. You can collect a Bookstart pack from your local library.

Youngsters aged 4 to 12 years can take part in the Summer Reading Challenge, organised each year by The Reading Agency.



LOCAL ATTRACTIONS

ACTON BURNELL CASTLE

In the heart of Acton Burnell, the remains of this 13th century sandstone castle are free to visit and enjoy. Also check out the neighbouring St Mary's Church, also constructed in the 13th century, which contains fascinating memorials to local dignitaries, including a portrayal of Sir Richard Lee as a knight with his wife beside him and his 3 sons and 9 daughters around him. Follow signs for Acton Burnell Castle from the village crossroads. Parking available.

LANGLEY CHAPEL

Tucked away in Langley is a 14th century chapel set in a peaceful field, and featuring 17th century pews. Free to visit. Follow the road from Acton Burnell to Ruckley, turning left at the Langley Chapel sign. Limited parking.

PITCHFORD HALL

Occasional tours and events are held at this Tudor country house at Pitchford, the grounds of which houses a picturesque treehouse where Queen Victoria once played. For details of events, please go to their Facebook page (search for Pitchford Hall).

ATTINGHAM PARK

National Trust owned estate featuring a Regency mansion and 200 acres of parkland, including woods, open parkland, a walled garden and children's play field Resident herd of fallow deer. Dogs welcome on leads in grounds, and off lead in some designated areas. Go to www.nationaltrust.org.uk/attingham-park for more information and admission prices.

ATTINGHAM FARM

CARDING MILL VALLEY AND THE LONG MYND

WENLOCK PRIORY

The picturesque remains of a medieval priory, built on the site of an Anglo-Saxon monastery, and also featuring a cloister garden, filled with topiary. SHROPSHIRE HILLS DISCOVERY CENTRE

On the A49 at Craven Arms, the Centre offers 30 acres of riverside meadows with accessible paths, a 'Shropshire Hills Through Time' exhibition (including a replica of the famous mammoth skeleton discovered in Condover), and a café. Dogs welcome on and off the lead. Handy parking at St Julians car park (parking charges apply). Public toilets available. A riverside path also runs from the Quarry towards the Monkmoor area of Shrewsbury and then on to Uffington.

LYTH HILL COUNTRY PARK

Spectacular views of the Shropshire countryside from this site, which features open grassland and oak woodland. Popular with ramblers, joggers and dog walkers. Also forms part of a long-distance bridleway for horse riders. Two car parks available, accessed from Lyth Hill Road in Bayston Hill (postcode SY3 0BT). Free entry and open all year round.

IRONBRIDGE GORGE MUSEUMS

Something for all the family, from living history at the Blists Hill Victorian Museum to examples of the best china of the era at Coalport China Museum. This collection of 10 museums, centred around the town of Ironbridge, offers an insight into different aspects of the Industrial Revolution. LAND OF LOST CONTENT, MUSEUM OF POPULAR CULTURE

Spread over four floors of the old Market Hall in Craven Arms, this museum boasts that it contains examples of 'everything that you, your parents, your grandparents and your children owned, used, played with and threw away' over the last 100 years. LOCAL CHURCHES

The churches in Acton Burnell (St. Mary's), Frodesley (St. Mark's) and Pitchford (St. Michael and All Angels) are part of the United Benefice of Condover and are coordinated under the ministry of our Rector, Reverend Geoff Garrett.

Acton Burnell and Pitchford Churches date from the early 1200s. Frodesley Church stands on the ground of two previous church buildings, but the current building was erected in 1809. Langley Chapel is managed by English Heritage and hosts one service a year – usually on the 3rd Sunday of September at 3pm.

The churches have a pattern of services each month which is constant, but is subject to change due to celebrating the annual Christian Festivals. These changes are advertised in Village Views, The Parish magazine (Benefice News), on church notice boards and on the website www.unitedbeneficeofcondover.co.uk.

A Holy Communion service is held at Pitchford at 11.30am on the first Sunday of each month. At Acton Burnell Holy Communion is held on the second Sunday of the month at 8.45am, and Evensong is held at 6.30pm on the third Sunday of the month. A rota of Festival services will take place at Frodesley, including Christmas and Easter, and also featuring special rural services such as Harvest, Plough Sunday, Rogation and Lammas.


